# Pastor's Pen

"I pray that your love will overflow more and more, and that you will keep on growing in knowledge and understanding. For I want you to understand what really matters, so that you may live pure and blameless lives until the day of Christ's return." Philippians 1:9-10

What matters to you? Is it your family? Pet? Lake home? Career? Reputation? Bank Balance? Sports Team? Hobby? There are a great many things that we deem important in this world, but honestly, some are more important than others.

The apostle Paul called the Christians at Philippi to "understand what really matters, so that you may live pure and blameless lives until the day of Christ's return." This years' Stewardship Theme is "Measuring What Matters." We explored this theme last year with sermons and Bible studies on Allegiances, Faith, Compassion, Generosity, Money, and Provision.

We're taking up the theme again, because there are a few more things we think really matter and are worth exploring: the power of PRAYER, the need for RESPECT, how FAITH moves us forward, and the call to SERVE. Here is a sneak peek at our campaign Sundays:

**PRAYER** (Sept. 29). We will try something new at Federated Church: a service for healing. We will offer time for corporate prayer and individual prayer at prayer stations. Church may look and feel a little different that day, but if we truly think prayer matters, we ought to practice it!

**RESPECT** (Oct. 6). As the political machine ramps up for the elections in November, it is good for us to remember what unites us. Jesus did not always agree with everyone he met, but he did treat everyone with respect as children of God, made in the image and likeness of the Creator.

**FAITH** (Oct 13). It may be difficult to see God as we travel through periods of spiritual darkness, but God knows the path we are on, and most importantly, God can see us!

**SERVICE** (Oct 20). Full-service banks, restaurants, and gas stations are going out of style, but not full-service people who are following the example of Jesus.

Prayer. Respect. Faith. Service. These are things that really matter. As Christians, we are called to practice these things authentically and compassionately as we await Christ's return.

The work we do as Christians – giving hope to the world, shining light into dark places, sharing the Good News of Christ's grace and forgiveness – these things really matter. How do we measure them? One heart at a time. One kind deed at a time. One hope-filled word at a time.

According to our policy, we are able to help each family or individual three times during a 12 month period, with up to \$100 a time, depending on funds. We assist with food, utilities, rent, and, in emergency situations, a night at a hotel. During August we were able to help **4** families or individuals through the local mission fund. We gave a total of **\$400** for food cards, rent and utilities.

#### Wednesday Night Children/Youth Family Meal

There is a new opportunity for individuals who may not be able to come volunteer on Wednesday nights. We are encouraging people to consider bringing in the ingredients or financially contributing to our Wednesday night dinners after Kidz Club and confirmation. This is a special time for families, kids, youth, and leaders to break bread together and have fun connecting with one another. We are creating a calendar and meal fund for this special ministry to our families, more details will be coming. Please prayerfully consider if you would like to support the Wednesday night meals in some way through financial support, picking up ingredients for meals, or volunteer with meal prep and serving.

#### Kidz Club (K-6)

Kidz Club begins on Wednesday, September 11 after school. Children can ride the bus from Kennedy School, and you can look for Pastor Doug. This fall our Kidz Club series will feature the life of one of the most famous people in the Bible, Joseph son of Jacob, grandson of Isaac. Joseph's story is one that illustrates just how faithful God is to those who seek Him. Joseph goes from being the favored son to a slave and a prisoner to the second in charge of Egypt during a time of serious challenges. He is faithful to God, and God uses whatever circumstances Joseph finds himself in for God's glory. We will be hearing portions of his story each week and watching short illustrative clips from "Joseph: King of Dreams." By studying Joseph's life, we can learn to trust that God is indeed with each of us as well, using our lives and circumstances for good.

We spend time each week learning, singing, doing crafts, and playing games in the gym. Our wonderful volunteers are there to help make this a favorite time for our kids.

# Confirmation/Middle School Youth Group (7-9 Grade)

Confirmation kicks off this fall with a parent meeting on Sunday, September 15, after worship. Class begins on Wednesday, September 18 after school. Youth are encouraged to ride the bus to church along with the Kidz Club kids.

Our annual confirmation retreat is September 20-22, at Clearwater Forest. Like Kidz Club, we will be diving deep into the life of Joseph as told in Genesis. There is so much to apply to our own lives in Joseph's story, and I am excited to lead our youth in discovering more about God and His hand in our lives through this special weekend. Please pray for our confirmation students, our teachers, our retreat volunteers, and our retreat weekend as our youth grow closer to God and one another.

As in the past few years, we will hold a youth group gathering rather than confirmation class on a given Wednesday. It is beneficial to have opportunities for fellowship and an occasional mission activity along with attending class.

### Senior High Youth Group (9-12 grade)

Our senior high youth group begins on Wednesday, September 11. Many of our youth gather each Wednesday around 7:30pm. We have several young people who choose to come after school or at dinner time to spend the afternoon/evening at church. We always discuss what topics our youth would like to focus on, and I tend to throw in some topics that are related to current events and issues. Each week we like to explore how we can live our faith during a world that does not look favorably upon being a Christian. With the wonderful volunteer leadership of Hollis Davenport, Madalyn Dent, and Molly Stoddard, we have rich conversations and times of encouragement and prayer with our impressive youth.

### Sunday School (K-12)

Sunday school for children and youth K-12th is every Sunday beginning on September 15 after worship. We have a team of teachers committed to spending time each week learning alongside our children and youth. This fall our K-1st class will begin a year-long journey through the most important lessons of the Bible. They will get a chance to learn the major stories and people who tell God's story for us. Our 2nd-6th grade students will do at least two series this year, beginning with "The 13 Most Important Lessons About God." These lessons we will focus on topics such as the trinity, the goodness of God, Jesus as both human and divine, the function of the Holy Spirit, and other topics that relate to our understanding of God. Our older youth will have a similar opportunity to study the fundamentals of faith along with a variety of topics as they relate to our Christian faith. We love spending time together learning how best to live out our faith.

#### Women's Bible Study

Our Women's Bible study will begin on Tuesday, September 10 at 11:15am in the parlor. Our focus this fall will be on Paul's epistle to the Colossians. This Pauline letter addresses the identity and deity of Jesus Christ as God. The church community in Colossae struggled false teachings and sought to know the truth of who Jesus was. This is important for believers even today, as our understanding of who and what Jesus is directly impacts how we live out our daily lives of faith. We love welcoming new faces.

#### **Revelation Bible Study**

After a summer break our Revelation Bible study group will resume meeting this fall. We are still deciding the best date to start in consideration of farming schedules, travel, etc. We will be starting the second half of this challenging book of the Bible, trusting God to bless our understanding and application. Rather than giving us this text to facilitate fear, God loves His people so much that He provided us with a blueprint for the future. Our attempt to appreciate and comprehend this book together is an act of faith in Jesus, the True God, Who WINS!


